TEACHING STAFF

From 1979 up to and including 1999, in the 20 years of the Russian Orthodox Church School, 41 teachers have taught at the school. The teaching staff was composed of Russian language, Religious Instruction, choir and dancing teachers as well as accompanying pianists for the choir, (see list of teachers). Some teachers had dual roles of teaching Russian language as well as choir or dance.

The longest serving teachers have been: Natalie Kozin, Father Basil Yakimov, Svetlana Rodionov, Ludmilla Novitski and Irene Ovchinnikov.

CURRICULUM

In 1979 the curriculum was unstructured.

In 1981 the subjects taught were Russian Language, both oral and written, Russian History, Russian Geography, Scripture and Singing. Classes were held in the afternoon.

In 1987 the classes were held from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm, three and a half hours. There were four classes: Kindergarten, Infants and Primary and Senior level studies. The aim was to give the students basic instruction in the Russian language, written and oral, as well as introduce them to some aspects of culture. Religious Instruction was taught. The aim of the senior class was to prepare the students for external examinations should they desire to sit for them. The basic concepts for this examination were also taught to the junior classes.

In 1988, the year of the Australian Bicentenary, the program for the Senior classes was accredited by the ACT Schools Authority. This accredited course was based on the Hawker Russian Curriculum taught by Alan Chalmers. Mr Chalmers was also a teacher at the Russian School for about a year. Some time later he died. He will be remembered for promoting the Russian language.

In 1988 four students: Ekaterina Alexeeff, Michael Borodin, Ekaterina Makeev and Larissa Zoska were accredited Russian on their Year 12 Certificate.

In 1989 classes were held from 9.30 am to 12.30 pm, for three hours. Again there were four classes: Kindergarten, Infants, Primary, Iower Secondary and Russian as a Second Language. The Senior classes were preparing for the Year 12 Certificate level as accredited by the ACT Schools Authority.

In 1990 classes were held for three hours. There were two classes for Russian as a Second Language: one for 4-7 year olds and the second for 9-14 year olds. There was

also a Kindergarten for Russian speaking children and a composite class grouped according to age and ability.

In 1992 classes were held 9.00 am to 1.00 pm, running for four hours. There were four classes: one for children with very little or no Russian and the other three classes grouped according to age. Three students were studying at College level in order to gain accreditation by the ACT Department of Education. Dance classes were also available.

In 1993 three students: Victor Bozhanov, Irene Rodionov and Lenna Shoustov were accredited Russian on their Year 12 Certificate.

In 1994 classes were held from 10.00 am to 1.30 pm, three and a half hours. There were four classes: Kindergarten, Lower Primary, Upper Primary and Russian as a second language. Dancing classes were an extracurriculum activity.

In 1996 class were held from 9.00 am to 1.00 pm, four hours . There were five classes including Russian as a Second Language. Dance classes were an extra curriculum activity. Two students: Marianna de Wouytch and Natalie Long were accredited Russian on their Year 12 Certificate.

In 1998 the classes were the same as for 1996.

Now in 1999 the classes are the same as for 1996 except there are no Russian as a Second Language and Dance classes.

From 1988-1999, under the direction of Irene Ovchinnikov, Academic Principal, seven students have attained Russian accreditation on their Year 12 Certificate.
